Village of Donalda- The Museum was granted funding through a community food initiative provided by the Village in 2023 & 2024. #### **The Creamery Conservation Project**

Woodland Dairy opened in 1924, successfully serving the community for nearly two decades until 1937, when the local farmers came together to rebrand the business as the Donalda Co-operative Creamery.

The business officially closed in 1987 and was one of the last remaining independent Creameries in the province following the formation of the Alberta Dairy Pool. It is now only one of two remaining creamery buildings of its kind in Alberta. (The other being the Markerville Creamery).

The Creamery was an important economic force in Donalda's history, keeping locals afloat during times of drought and flooding. The business was very community oriented; farmers would often leave a grocery list with their cream during the busy harvesting season and Creamery employees would ensure the cans were returned with the groceries inside.

The Creamery became famous for its prize winning "Donalda Maid Butter", and was also instrumental in organizing and sponsoring the Donalda 4-H Dairy Club.

The building was acknowledged as a Provincial Heritage Site in 2010. Today, the Museum is working to conserve the Creamery and has been vigorously raising funds to restore it to its original glory.

To date, we have successfully completed the hazardous abatement process and have made necessary repairs to the original siding. Our next step will be to replace the cedar-shingle roof and repair the windows and doors to complete the outer restoration in order to begin on restoring the interior!
